Art. 21. Merit Scholarships

- (1) Merit scholarships are granted to students in POLITEHNICA Bucharest, registered at full-time university study programs, no matter the form of financing.
- (2) Merit scholarship mention in align. (1) can be granted to students who fit at least one of the following criteria:
 - a) They achieved excellent results in education, i.e. they have the highest averages from the same year of study of a study program;
 - b) They achieved scientific performance, innovation and patents.
- (3) The amount of the merit scholarship is higher than the amount of the social scholarship.
- (4) The merit scholarships are distributed in descending order of the averages, within the limit of the budget of each faculty.
- (5) The average for the scholarship is calculated by taking into consideration previous arrears also, as follows:
 - a) For the first semester, for students in year 1 of undergraduate university program, the average by which they are ordered is the average from admission to the undergraduate cycle;
 - b) For the first semester, for students in year 1 of master's university studies, the average by which they are ordered is the average from admission to the master's cycle;
 - c) For the first semester, for students in years II-IV of the undergraduate cycle and in the second year of the master's cycle, the average according to which they are ordered is the annual average of the previous year;
 - d) For the second semester, the average by which the students are ordered is the average from the previous semester.
- (6) **Merit scholarship grade I** is granted as follows:
 - a) Merit scholarship grade I is granted only to students in years II-IV of the undergraduate cycle and to students in year II of the master cycle, if the general average of the previous year is at least 9,70 and the respective student has achieved at least 30 points according to the list of criteria provided in Annex 1 to the present methodology.  - b) Merit scholarship grade I is granted at the beginning of the academic year, during an academic year and is reviewed after the winter session, when the



faculty scholarship committee may decide to withdraw the scholarship of those students who have not achieved adequate professional results.

- c) Candidates will submit to the scholarship committee of the faculty a file that will include:
- ✓ application form accompanied by C.V.,
 - ✓ -the list of participation in professional competitions, published papers and articles,
 - ✓ the list of participation in scientific research contracts
 - ✓ other supporting documents.

The file must be submitted physically to the FILS secretariat, according to scholarship allocation calendar.

(7) Merit scholarship grade II can be granted from the scholarship fund of the faculty, starting with the second year of studies for students from undergraduate studies and second year for Master's students, who in the previous year or after the winter session, obtained the average ≥ 9.50 .

(8) Merit scholarship grade III is granted as follows:

- a) Merit scholarship grade III can be granted to students admitted in the first year in the undergraduate cycle, who obtained, upon admission, the average $\geq 8,00$;
- b) Merit scholarship grade III can be granted to students of the II, III and IV years of the undergraduate cycle who, at the end of the previous academic year (at the granting of scholarships in the first semester) or after the winter session (at the granting of scholarships in the second semester) obtained the average $\geq 8,00$;
- c) Merit scholarship grade III can also be granted to students from the first year of master studies if they have obtained at the admission contest (at the granting of scholarships in the first semester) or after winter session (at the granting of scholarships in the second semester) the average ≥ 8.00 and also, to II year students of the master studies cycle who obtained the average over 8.00 in the first semester or in the previous year.

The scholarship awarding committee will establish additional criteria to decide between students who have obtained the same average. The criteria for the allocation of the scholarship fund allocated to FILS will be established by the Scholarship Awarding Committee according to the above-mentioned Methodology (Art. 1).
